- · Power and Water are not guaranteed, bring your RV full of water. Power will be limited and will not run your air conditioner.
- The Community Leader/FFA Advisor who is responsible for all camp occupants must sign all reservation forms.
- Leaders/Advisors are required to supply to the fair office a camp map indicating the location of all families after camp is set up- for emergency purposes.
- By signing this I agree to the Redwood Empire Fair camping and State Rules.
- The names of every 4-H member, FFA member, Independent junior, chaperones/parents and/or younger family members staying in the camp space must be on this camp reservation form and identified as such on the form.
- Cell Phone Numbers to reach a responsible adult in case of emergency is required for all spaces (it may be the same number).
- Camp Spaces are for Campers, Trailers, Tents or RV's.
- Camping is not mandatory.

2024 Redwood Empire Fair

Please read the camp registration form carefully because it is new.

It is the intent of the Fair to provide a safe and enjoyable environment for all livestock exhibitors and their families. To ensure a safe and enjoyable fair, it is imperative that all participants are familiar with the rules and their ramifications. By signing and submitting an entry form you acknowledge having read and understood the state and local rules and agree to abide by them. Forms that are missing information or not filled out properly will not be accepted and returned to the club or chapter.

Particular attention should be given to the Rules for California Fairs 2024, which state, "Fair management shall deny entry or disqualify and remove any exhibit or exhibitor that has violated State and or Local Rules".

The ability to camp at the fairgrounds is a privilege. Abuse of this privilege may impact future exhibitors. In addition to the complete list of rules in the premium book, rules mandate the following:

- 1. CAMPING IS NOT MANDATORY AND CANNOT BE MADE MANDATORY.
- 2. NO MOTORIZED GOLF KARTS/SIDE BY SIDES OF ANY TYPE.
- 3. POWER AND WATER ARE NOT GUARANTEED, PLEASE HAVE RV WATER TANK FULL WHEN YOU ARRIVE. IF AVAILABLE, POWER WILL BE LIMITED AND WILL NOT RUN AIR CONDITIONERS. Power and water are not guaranteed.
- 4. NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED ON FAIR PROPERTY AT ANY TIME. Except service dogs.
- 5. Campers will line up in the main parking lot of the fairgrounds according to a predetermined schedule provided to each club/chapter prior to fair. Campers enter the main parking lot from State Street.
- 6. Camp registration/wristband request application forms must be submitted by June 5, 2024, by 5:00 p.m. Late submission may lose their place in the rotation. The Community Leader/FFA Adviser/Adult responsible for campsite must sign all reservation forms. Contact the entry department for forms by phone (707) 462-3884; fax (707) 462-2641 or email, exhibits@redwoodempirefair.com.
- 7. When measuring your RV measure from hitch to bumper.
- 8. A fee of \$10 will be charged for replacing a complementary wristband, any paid for wristbands will be charged full price for replacement.
- 9. Campsites will be set-up Sunday, July 28, 2024, time TBT.; if campground applicants exceed space available the Fair may make adjustment in space size or location to accommodate for more spaces. If an RV is bigger than the space purchased there may not be space available for RV. Applications will be accepted on a first come first serve basis. No camping in campsites until Tuesday, July 30, 2024.
- 10. Camping and R.V. units must be kept within space allocated and not protrude into a designated FIRE LANE.
- 11. Camp packets (wristbands, camp, and parking passes) will be handed out to Leaders/Advisor. Independents may pick up their packets at the fair office. If you have any questions or concerns call the Fair at (707) 462-3884 ask for the Camping Entry Department.
- 12. The only animals allowed past the fence to the campground are service dogs. No other livestock is allowed past the campground fence. Anyone in violation of these rules will be asked to leave the fairgrounds and forfeit their premiums.
- 13. Campers are required to use a 12 AWG cord (20 AMPS maximum). Cord must be rated for hard usage and must be free of any defects such as fraying or broken insulation, exposed conductors, or missing ground blade. Cords not meeting these safety requirements will be confiscated. Cords may not meet in the middle of the road.
- 14. No leaking hoses will be allowed; all hoses must be in good repair with proper fittings and washers.
- 15. Use of generators may be prohibited if exhaust creates a hazard for other campsites.
- 16. No use of generators after 10pm. NO GENERATORS MAY BE STORED IN HORSE BARNS.

- 17. No cars, trucks, or vans unless used as a camping unit, will be allowed in the Camp areas except for temporary loading or unloading of equipment. Camp vehicles are to be parked in the designated parking lot at the east end of the camp area. All camping passes must be always kept in the window of vehicle. All camping wristbands must be worn to identify those that are camping.
- 18. For the safety of all, fire lanes will be a minimum of 20 feet and are to be always kept clear. Any vehicle parked in a camp space, no parking area, or fire lane will be towed at owner's expense. (V.C.22500.1)
- 19. Camp needs to be vacant by 1pm, Sunday, August 4, 2024.
- 20. All pens including breeding, must be clean before leaving fairgrounds.
- 21. Anyone that is exhibiting found to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be held responsible for their actions, which may include removal from the property and all fair activities including the auction.
- 22. Disruptive behavior will not be tolerated.
- 23. Alcohol or drug use or possession will not be tolerated.
- 24. Each camp space must have an adult chaperone over the age of 21 years old staying in the camp space.
- 25. If a vehicle is parked in the fire lane, a camp space, or no parking area, will be towed at the owner's expense without notice to vehicle owner.
- 26. No Swimming pools or fires.
- 27. Camping is only for exhibitors, leaders, parents, and chaperons. Siblings will need special permission from the 4-H Community Leader or FFA Advisor.
- 28. All camping shall be in the assigned camp space, and not protrude into a designated fire lane. Once assigned, a camp space cannot be moved without permission.
- 29. Camp curfew: 11:00PM.
- 30. GENERATOR CURFEW 10:00PM
- 31. All visitors must leave the camp area by 11:00 P.M. No visitors are allowed to stay overnight.
- 32. Exhibitors will not be allowed in the barns past 11:00 P.M.
- 33. Vehicles blocking other vehicles, parked in fire lane, or blocking a road will be towed at owners expense.
- 34. Problems should be brought to respective 4-H Club leaders or FFA Chapter advisors first unless an emergency situation exists. If that leader is not able to deal with it, the leader will bring it to the Fair Manager.
- 35. All fees must be paid with one check from Clubs/Chapters. Independent; cash or cashier check no later than **June 5, 2024**.

The ultimate ramification for failing to abide by the rules is the removal of the exhibitor, the exhibit from the fairgrounds, forfeiture of premiums, and all other awards including possible removal from auction. In order to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all, fair management will remove those exhibitors that show disregard for State and local rules. If a camper/site is asked to leave the RV may not be available to be removed until 8/4/2024 after 8 a.m. If an RV is left in the field after 1:00 p.m. on 8/4/2024 the Redwood Empire Fair reserves the right to remove it at owners expense.
